
African Penguin

History



- Fossils from 10-12 million years and one 50 million year old fossil of the penguin were found in Africa
- Originally 4 species in South Africa
- Humans did not kill earlier species
- Impacted the surviving species African Penguins
- Been on endangered list 4 years

Traits

- Black feet
- One of the smallest penguins
- Small pink gland above each eye specific to species

Fun Facts

- "Jackass" penguin
- Spheniscus demersus (scientific name)
- Adapt well in zoo environments
 (most common penguin in zoos)
- Household cat is a common predator

Human Impact

- Fisheries cause decline in penguin's food source
- Nests are destroyed for fertilizer
- Impacts force living in vulnerable
 areas = offspring endangerment
- Oil spills are not common but can have persistent effects

Habitat

- They make nests out of their own excrement (guano or poop) under bushes and rocks
- Found in large colonies along the southwestern coast of Africa
- Live in warm climates

Species Dependencies

Reproduction

- Sardines, squid, and crustaceans
 form up an African penguins' diet,
 so global warming and overfishing,
 will impact them directly
- Seals and sharks rely on penguins for their diet- no penguins no food


- Mated penguins will continue to bond for the rest of their lives, having 2-4 eggs per year, which helps with penguin output
 - Young penguins ready to mate can be aggressive

Biodiversity

- Located in same area
- Not much biodiversity in species
- Colonies are close together
- More diversity = more survivability
- Aren't too diverse = disease/habitat
